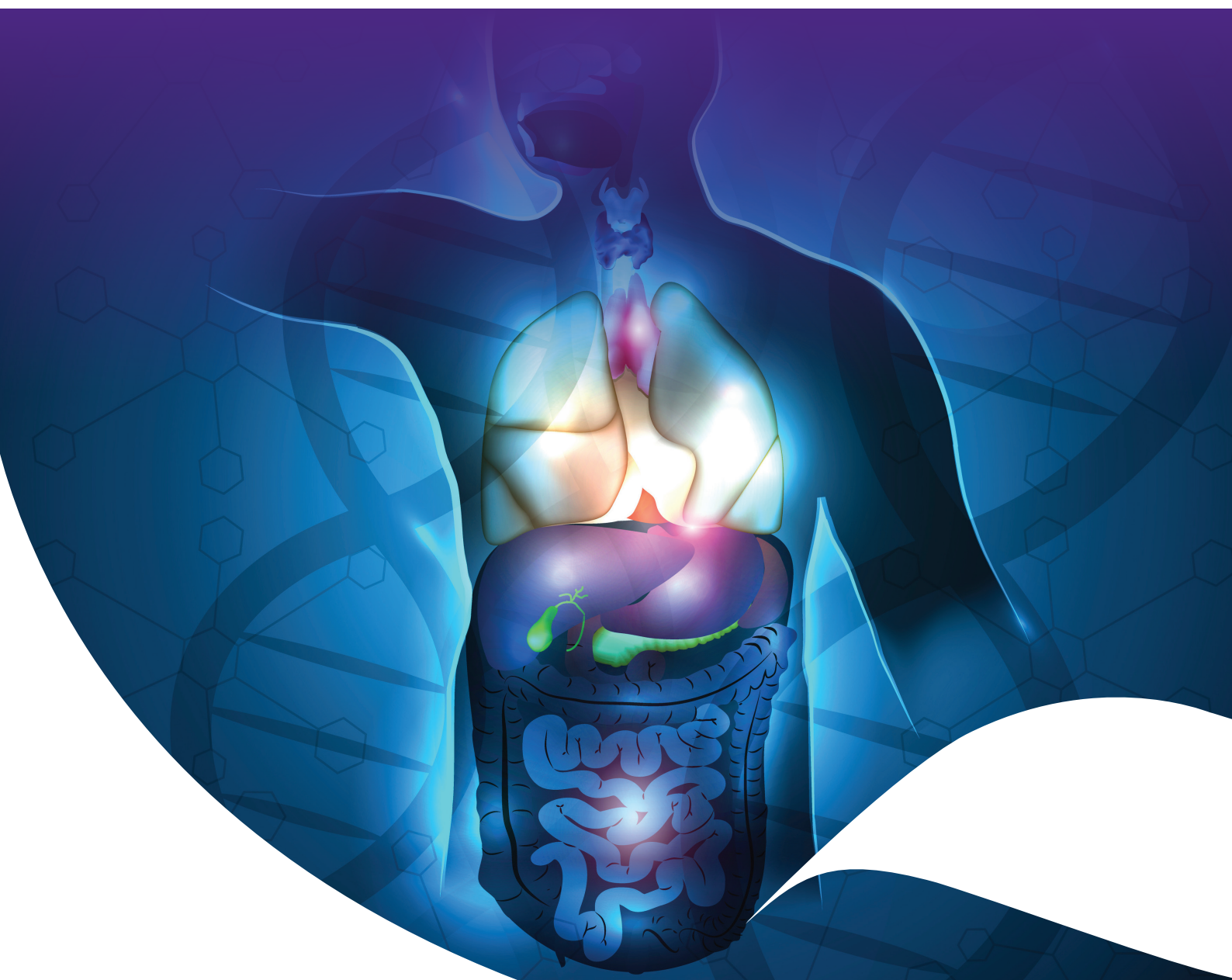
# Brisbane Transplant Infectious Diseases Meeting

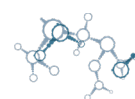
